

Hen Sorenson, age 89, of Spencer, Iowa formerly of Sioux Rapids, Iowa died Saturday, September 17, 2016 at the Spencer Municipal Hospital.

Allen Lee Sorenson was born nearly 90 years ago on November 5, 1926 to Thelma (Wing) and Sigurd Sorenson. Allen graduated from Highview in 1944.

On August 17, 1947 Allen took the hand of Gayla Mae Hanson at the First Lutheran Church in Sioux Rapids. To this union, they were blessed with two children. In 1948, Rebecca Ruth and in 1952, Robert Allen.

Allen and Gayla made their home in rural Linn Grove while the kids were young both working at the Highview School. Their 69 years of marriage was filled with many jobs for Allen. Allen was a person who enjoyed talking to people and working with his hands. Allen helped on the family farm south of Linn Grove, worked as a janitor at Highview, sold life insurance, was a traveling sales person for Wynn's Friction Proofing, and worked on appliances. His pride and joy came when he purchased the hardware store in Sioux Rapids in 1968, where not only did he have all the nuts and bolts you needed, he was a very talented electrician and plumber. It was not unusual for the house phone to ring in the middle of the night and Allen was up and on his way to help someone with their furnace that was out. Sorenson Hardware was a staple of Sioux Rapids through the early 2000s. Allen's son, Robert, worked at the store in the early years, and later on, Allen brought in his son-in-law, James, and grandson, John, to help with the service calls. In 2004, Gayla convinced Allen it was time to retire from the hardware store, and converted their home into a small bed and breakfast so that they could continue to entertain people and share the stories of the people of the community.

Allen was a 50 year member of the Enterprise Lodge of Sioux Rapids and Buena Vista Chapter of the Eastern Star. He was the Past Master of Enterprise Lodge Sioux Rapids and was the secretary for the last few decades. He was the Past Patron of the Buena Vista Chapter of OES Sioux Rapids. Allen actively supported both organizations until he could no longer climb the steps to attend meetings. Allen belonged to other Masonic bodies including the Tall Corn Study group, Commandary, Royal Arch Masons, and White Shrine.

Allen was an amazing historian, he knew more about the founders of Sioux Rapids than most historical books. Allen took on a task to learn about the Vikings and their paths through Buena Vista and Clay Counties. Allen mapped out the Viking Rocks throughout the counties and loved to share that information with anyone from historical meetings to school classrooms.

Allen was a very outgoing pillar of the community. Often the grandkids would introduce themselves as... Allen Sorenson's grandchild. Allen served the community as the mayor for two terms and also served on the city council numerous terms. Allen was a proud and active member of the First United Church in Sioux Rapids. He served on many committees, counsels, and led the choir. He was also noted for meditating during the sermon, as he described it, if you caught him with his eyes closed.

Allen always made time for his family, whether it be helping with a home fix-it project, or tutoring during those hard history or math lessons, he was always patient and kind with his family. Allen attended as many activities as he was able from sporting events, musical performances, to recitals and plays.

If you had time for a cup of coffee, Allen had time to share some of his knowledge with you. He enjoyed talking about the past and present. Allen always had an opinion on pressing issues, and shared his view point. Allen enjoyed playing cards with a group of people or taking Gayla on in a game of cribbage. Allen enjoyed doing puzzles, or any sort of word search, always keeping his mind sharp, and he never missed a rerun episode of MASH.

Once the decision was made to move to Riverview Terrace in Spencer, so that medical needs could be met, Allen grasped the new faces and environment sharing stories and taking part in a variety of activities.

Allen Lee Sorenson, entered into the gates of Heaven on September 17, 2016.


