Bonnie Blomberg, age 80, of Albert City, Iowa died August 28, 2016 at Pleasant View Home in Albert City.

Bonnie Belle Anderson was born December 13, 1935 in Dixon, Nebraska to Lenus and Lillie (Olson) Anderson. She was baptized and confirmed in the Evangelical Free Church. Growing up, Bonnie attended school in Laurel, Nebraska. Following graduation, she attended Grace Bible College in Omaha, Nebraska.

Bonnie will be remembered as a loving wife, mother, grandmother, sister, aunt and friend. She will be deeply missed by all who knew and loved her.
